

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Introduction

The Intercontinental School of Economics and Applied Sciences (ISEAS) is committed to maintaining a respectful, inclusive, and professional learning environment for all students. This Student Code of Conduct outlines the expectations for student behavior and the standards that all students are required to uphold.
